Incidents that have been addressed:

Lin McDowell was fined after repeated warnings of letting her dog run loose and pooping on the street and others lots.

Jackie Lanum was approached by the former committee concerning "Mercy" biting other dogs in the park. They had written a letter but it was not mailed to Jackie. On April 4th, we mailed a letter to Jackie stating that her dog must be on a 6' leash and muzzled anytime it is outside at DBR.

On April 10th Anne, Gail and Athena attended the appeal to the County from Kelly Gorley that her dog, Journey not be classified as a potential dangerous dog. This appeal was due to the attack from Journey on Penny's dog Dexter and Anne's dog, Oliver. The appeal was denied. A letter was mailed to Kelly on

April 20th stating that Journey must be a 6' leash and wear a muzzle any time outside at DBR.
