REQUEST FOR ACTION FROM THE DBWC BOARD

DBWC now owns 37.76 forested areas:

Eastland (11.06 acres)

The Nature Trail (11.3 acres)

The Well Land (15.4 acres)

We believe it is in the best interest of the park to have a Forestry Committee to advise the board about the management of our forests according to the strategic values of our park.

Some of us have taken a forestry class and hope to get others interested in learning about our forests. We have certified forestry people wanting to help us learn and manage in a healthy way.

We want to ask DBWC members to help us explore and do research on what we have, using the forestry guidelines and the advice of the forestry people.
